By the Way...

Astronomers are great believers in nothing—a nothing with a lot of substance to it. These star gazers theorize that galaxies and galaxy clusters are pregnant with some sort of exotic material that is invisible to us. They call it *dark matter*. Despite decades of using every imaginable means of detection—from gamma-ray telescopes in outer space to cryogenic subatomic particle monitors buried deep inside a northern Minnesota mine—they can't tell you exactly what it is and they can't prove it actually exists, but they are confident it's there. They only know that dark matter matters.

But it gets even more mystifying as astrophysicists have discovered *dark energy*. Astronomers have concluded that dark energy comprises about 73% of the total universe and dark matter about 23%. That leaves only 4% of the entire universe visible to us! In other words, if you are basing all of your knowledge on your senses—what you can detect and measure—then you don't know much because you are limiting yourself. Even at our best, we modern, rational, science-minded, materialist human beings are mostly in the dark. There's a lot more going on in this world than we can imagine.

Paul writes (Colossians 2:15-17): *The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.*

We are also told (Hebrews 11:1): *Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.*

Astrophysicist make you read that a little differently... and confidently.
